1. RIBI Library projects



➤ 37 clubs responded to a survey, out of 52 [i.e., over 70%].

➤ *Many of the top projects were concerned with response to Disaster. Top projects, in terms of support:*

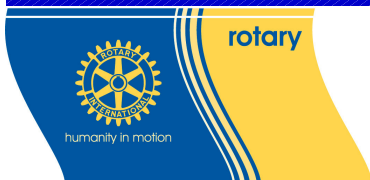
2. Clubs' own initiatives

... WCS [World Community Service Projects]

- Projects in over 15 countries, supported by £94,200* funds. Some highlights:
 - Build a school in Kwazulu Natal, S Africa: £12,000
 - Children's Hospice in Belarus: £9,500
 - Rotary Ophthalmic Initiative: £8,500
 - Water project in Uganda: £3,000
 - On-going support for Sparrow Village (AIDS orphans), S Africa: approx £6,000

- Excludes items sent "in kind" with aid convoys or Rotarians' time on practical projects.
