Projects Exchange Spotlight

Project No. WO5083*

The Rotary Club of Istanbul-Maslak in Turkey is collecting donations to fully fund its school repair project in a local village.

In 1992, the residents of Kayagöze Köyü left their homes in response to terrorist threats. In the last few years, they have been encouraged to return to the now peaceful village. Unfortunately, all of the buildings in the area have been demolished or have fallen in disrepair.


The government is repairing many buildings, but will not be renovating the school. Since the return of many families to the village is contingent upon the repair of the school, the local Rotary club has financed US\$50,000 for the project. The club is collecting funds in order to finance the remaining costs of providing two additional classrooms, a lavatory, heating system, library furniture, and a computer.

Needed:

- US\$20,000 total**
 - US\$5,000/construction of girl's lavatory
 - US\$3,000/furniture, US\$6,000/heating system
 - US\$2,000/library books and equipment
 - US\$2,000/computer and printer
 - US\$2,000/school supplies
