Project name:

**Emergency Box Scheme**  
(Registered Charity 1015854)

Project goal:

To provide a ready stock of useful items for use in disaster areas in any part of the world.

Rotary service type:

Collection and forwarding.

Unique selling proposition:

Fill a Rotary Box, and help prevent someone filling a coffin.

Description:

Boxes are obtained by sending a cheque for £50 made payable to the Rotary Emergency Box Trust, with a 9" x 6" stamped, addressed envelope to contacts listed. **There is a choice of HOT or COLD boxes. Please refer to the list of contents and specify which box you require.**

A three-part card and acknowledgement slip will be sent and a box will be despatched to you from the warehouse. You should receive this within 30 days of the receipt of the cards. The boxes are then filled with the list of items provided.

Part 3 of the card should be packed in the box so that you may eventually receive a reply from the recipient. Part 1 & 2 should be stamped and securely attached to the outside of the box. Part 1 is returned to you when the box is returned to store. Part 2 will be sent to you when the box is sent to a disaster informing you of its ultimate destination.

The whole club can take part in the exercise and the local community can be involved through schools, youth groups, etc.

The cheque for £50 covers the cost of the box, its return to the store and its ultimate dispatch to a port of embarkation together with storage charges and insurance.

Benefits to club:

A simple low-cost project that everyone can take part in.
